
## Capstone Progress: Romanticization



## Themes:

- Void characters
  - Projecting ideas and ideals onto someone with minimal background
- Midwest emo
  - A cultural phase that became nostalgic quickly and resurfaced as an aesthetic not very long after its popularity
- Love
  - Shift away from the highly romanticized and idealized standard of romantic/passionate love and grand romantic gestures shown in media

## **Continuing Concepts**

- Revisiting Elaine Scarry's *The Body in Pain* 
  - Physical pain resists language and is to some extent untranslatable
    - Mental/psychological hardship is similarly elusive
- Scott Alexander Howard's "Nostalgia"
  - Nostalgia is selective: we can feel dissatisfaction with the present without preferring the past entirely
  - We can also feel nostalgia despite remembering the bad and sometimes traumatic aspects of the past we feel nostalgic for
- Connecting to personal experience
  - Feeling nostalgic for an objectively bad time, which can't really be conveyed with words
    - Example: I miss quarantine, but it was a bad time that we all experienced. If I try to explain why, people might not want to listen because they remember how bad it was
  - I'm getting surgery and I have to romanticize it to cope with the anxiety

- 1. GIF/animation to emulate the experienced past and feeling of nostalgia
- 2. Garment that romanticizes surgery despite it being bodily trauma
